Director's Note

"The meaning of life is to give life meaning." - Viktor E. Frankl

When I first encountered *Ride the Cyclone*, I didn't know what to make of it. It was hilarious yet heart wrenching; outlandish yet truthful; and at times, just plain weird—but with compellingly endearing characters and music I couldn't stop humming.

As I delved further into this world, I realized this piece demands prioritizing feelings over thoughts. My brain might not have known what to make of the appearance of sexy cat women in "Space Age Bachelor Man," the fortune-telling "machine" that seems to have real feelings, or the decapitated girl with a matching doll, but my heart was never confused about the emotions this show evokes or the questions it explores. What defines our time on earth? What constitutes a life well-lived? What makes a "good" person? Is death when we take our final breath—or when there is no one left to remember us?

Cyclone poses these questions through the humor and heartbreak of vibrant, flawed characters seeking closure before the inevitable occurs. I have so enjoyed investigating these ideas with this incredibly talented group of students. Just as in life, not all of these characters "win" in the conventional sense, but find victory in getting what they need.

When you leave, I invite you to do something kind for someone. Take a moment to appreciate something small. Tell your people you love them. Whether you came here today seeking catharsis, truth, connection, or a fun evening out, I hope you find it aboard our Cyclone.

Letter from the Chair

Welcome to Buffalo State Theater!

I personally invite you to get to know Buffalo State Theater – our educational team, our students, our productions, and our programs. We are a community of individuals brought together by an understanding of the power of live theater and the tangible benefits of theater training for a career in any industry.

Our productions explore what it means to be part of a team pursuing a singular goal. Our faculty and staff train students in rehearsals, scene and costume shops, during technical and dress rehearsals, and throughout performances. These contact hours with students are in addition to coursework and serve to deepen the examination of the responsibility and dexterity required of theater artists and practitioners. Students also have an opportunity to take on leadership positions in audience services, publicity, marketing, purchasing and budgeting, through the student-run USG organization, Casting Hall Productions.

Auditions for this show happened this past October, rehearsals began in November, and each student performer has trained for more than 175 hours with faculty, staff, and local professionals. They improved acting skills, expanded vocal training, and developed movement techniques to create the show you see today.

Our student assistant stage managers began in January and will log more than 100 hours of work by the final performance. Some of our student technicians started in January, training in the scene and costume shops, while others joined in February as board operators, wardrobe crew, and deck crew. These backstage positions fulfill 1-credit practicum requirements for the major. Each student puts in between 60 and 75 hours of work, mentored and trained by faculty and staff throughout the process.

Our student stage manager puts in the most hours of all, attending all rehearsals, design and production meetings, creating daily reports for the design and production teams and rehearsal reports for the actors. They arrive first, leave last, and are responsible for calling all the cues (and this show has several hundred!) during the live performances. Students who successfully train in this position are prepared for anything. They learn to simultaneously become benevolent leaders, project managers, on-the-spot problem solvers, time management experts, adept communicators, and, above all, to be the person who stays calm (or at least doesn't show signs of stress).

I share this with you so you can appreciate the work you see today in a new way. Theater doesn't just happen; it takes an extraordinary amount of work, dedication, collaboration, and commitment. When I look at the combined total of faculty, staff, and professional contact hours with our students on this production, it equates to more than 700 hours of on-the-job training!

I commend all of the individuals who came together over the past six months to bring this show to life. The responsibility and discipline required all throughout the process extends far beyond this building's four walls. Theater training is life training, and theater skills are transferable everywhere.
