DIRECTORS NOTE

When I was asked to direct a reading of TEACH for Buffalo State's First Thursday series last April, I was excited. When I was asked to direct the first ever production as part of the season, I was thrilled. Now that we are here, sharing it with you, I am over the moon! I've been well-acquainted with—and a huge fan of—this play since its draft stages. Each time I read it through development, I was captivated. Even now, when I have analyzed, watched over and over, and know practically every line, it still manages to keep me on the edge of my seat.

That is thanks to playwright Donna Hoke, whose ability to get to the heart of what it means to be human never ceases to amaze me. Like all of Hoke's plays, TEACH is a brilliant exploration of connection and humanity, which makes the work inherently relatable. Even if audience members haven't experienced situations identical to the ones depicted here, I am confident that forbidden attraction, loneliness, desire to connect and feel seen, uncertainty, and regret will resonate—they are universal. Perhaps more importantly, TEACH's deft examination of power imbalances and gender bias invites self-reflection and important discussion. If the conversations the cast and I have had in rehearsal are any indication, this play is even more relevant today than when Hoke wrote it in 2016.

This production is compelling in large part because of exceptional work by the cast and crew. So much of this story is deeply embedded in the student experience; it is fitting that students be the first to fully stage it. This is not an easy play, and these students rose to the challenge. I am indebted to their talent, maturity, and commitment. (An exciting note: in the coming weeks, TEACH will be published, and these stellar performers will be listed as the first production cast!)

Like all good plays, TEACH does not ask questions of the audience, but rather prompts audiences to ask the questions themselves. As Chris reminds Ken, "Curiosity doesn't end when the bell rings," so I hope your curiosity continues long after today's visit to Roosevelt High School.
